## ABOUT ROSSLAND MINES.

Red Mountain and Sophia Mountain  
Groups.

Special Character of the War  
Eagle, Le Roi and Centre Star  
Deposits—Victory-Triumph, Vel-  
vet and Other Properties on the  
Second-Name Hill-Stocks.

In a recent paper Mr. W. Hamilton  
Merritt, C.E., spoke of the ore in the  
Red Mountain group of mines at  
Rossland, which includes the War Eagle,  
Le Roi, Centre Star and other prop-  
erties:

"This group of mines is of peculiar in-  
terest. There is a very fine ledge of  
gold, which is where you find it, and  
like the famous gold-bearing conglomer-  
ates of Africa, the Red Mountain gold  
veins are without a parallel. The ore  
is virtually identical with the nickel ore  
found at Sudbury, in Ontario, but the  
form in which the two occur, how-  
ever, is very different. While both oc-  
cur in very basic rocks, the Sudbury ore  
being associated with a diorite and the  
Red Mountain ore with a gabbro, yet  
the Red Mountain ore occurs in masses and  
the Sudbury ore in well-defined  
strong fissure veins, often with a banded  
central streak of calcite. To give an ex-  
ample of the strength of the fissure  
traversing the Le Roi, Centre Star, etc.,  
it might be noted that in places the  
Le Roi mine the ore body has been ex-  
tracted across a width as great as 30  
feet, and that the average width of the  
stope, over 100 feet, is 200 feet. At the  
time of the discovery of the Red Mountain,  
if one versed in the geology of the  
Canadian ore fields, the outcrop of the Le  
Roi, he would probably have expressed  
an opinion that it might be worth  
saying for nickel, but that it would be  
hopeless to expect to find more than a  
trace of gold. Yet the smelter returns  
have given a steady yield from 14 to 25  
per cent in gold for the last couple of  
years, with from 1 to 3 per cent of  
copper and 2 per cent of silver. There is  
a very small proportion of free gold, the  
values being entirely extracted by smel-  
ing."

### THE SOPHIA MOUNTAIN.

Activity in and Value of This Portion  
of Rossland Camp.

Mr. E. G. Gatty Parker of Rossland,  
B.C., now here, in the course of a con-  
versation regarding the Sophia Mountain,  
stated:

"An interesting pamphlet, published by  
Parker & Co., 41 Victoria Street, en-  
titled, 'British Columbia, a Field for  
Mining Investment,' reference is made  
to the above named district, within  
four miles of Rossland, as one likely to  
develop into one of the richest gold  
copper producing sections of British Col-  
umbia."

"Such, indeed, would appear to be the  
case. Certainly that section is regarded  
to be at the present time one of the  
most important centres of mining activ-  
ity. The Rossland press quite lately  
informed the public that there was con-  
siderable movement in the Sophia Mountain  
properties, and that the largest part of  
present dealings were in properties of  
that neighborhood."

Reference is continually being made  
to men completing their assessments  
for the year, and of property  
owners and companies steadily doing  
development work. A glance at the  
list of the better-known properties may not  
be out of place. The two best known,  
of course, are the Victory-Triumph and  
the Prosperator group, owned by the An-  
conada Gold Mining Co., who are so  
satisfied with what they possess that  
they recently refused a cash offer of \$5  
large figure from London, Eng. They  
have eight claims, and from their work-  
ing ground have had some good assays;  
the Copper Chief Group, the Big Four,  
the Dally, the Wallingford, the Umalla,  
the Waverley and the Wallaroo  
group, owning five claims."

It is typical of the Sophia Mountain  
properties that the mineral lies not far  
from the surface. Thus on all of the  
above-mentioned claims fine showings  
were obtained at a depth of from 10 to  
50 feet, while the values were distinct-  
ly good. The Velvet had an assay of  
\$50 at a depth of 40 feet, and the Victory-  
Triumph had an assay of \$77 ore  
at a depth of 40 feet, although at sur-  
face there was not even a trace of gold  
in the assay."

Heavy figures have been obtained for  
Sophia Mountain properties, and it is  
a matter of difficulty to close out any  
deal for old prices, it being realized that  
the possibilities of the region are un-  
bounded. The Velvet consideration is  
based on reliable information as being  
\$22,000, the Prosperator, purchased by  
Tupper Syndicate, \$19,000, pretty good  
figures, you must admit for two claims  
owned by this syndicate. The Velvet  
claim, \$10,000, and the Weiser, \$5,000,  
while one-quarter interest in the Copper  
Chief group for the purchaser \$5,000.  
It would take a large sum of money to  
purchase the famous Copper Chief  
group on this basis, and the owners are  
not too anxious to sell, as I am well  
aware."

The Wallaroo group, referred to above,  
is looked upon with favor by mining  
men. Through the united efforts of  
Messrs. Parker & Co. and myself, we  
have obtained an excellent option of  
purchase, both as to terms and time,  
and it is our intention to form a syn-  
dicate to take them up and push work
