Fortunately for the little girl so heavily afflicted, her parents were in a position to secure a teacher from the Massachusetts Institution for the Education of the Blind, and such was her progress that in time she was able to come north to this institution itself, making always remarkable headway in whatever she took up. She learned to articulate, and finally to speak, at a school in New York, where she spent the winters of '94, '95 and '96, and her voice is said to be very pleasing. She began in

winters of '94, '95 and '96, and her voice is said to be very pleasing. She began in '93 to prepare for her higher education, and has 'succeeded in mastering French and German, 'as well as English. Last June she went to Cambridge to take the matriculation examination, which would admit her the examination, which would admit her the subjects being Greek La.

The examination questions were written out in Braille characters by Mr. Vining of the Perkins Institute. Think of being blind and deaf, and shut up with stiff examination papers written in strange characters! Needless to say, she passed successfully in every subject, What has she not accomplished, this girl to whom all the sweet sounds and sights of nature are unknown, and who has never known the joy of wafching familiar, loving, friendly faces!
