

WHEAT MARKETS ARE FIRM

Narrow Range in Chicago With Session Closing Steady.

Foreign Markets Were All Firm and Higher—Corn and Oats Featureless—Sharp Advance in Provisions—Latest Commercial News.

Wheat closed steady in Chicago today, after falling dull within a narrow range.

Liverpool wheat futures were strong today, closing 1/4 to 3/8 higher than on Friday last.

Stocks of wheat at Fort Arthur and Fort William on Dec. 27 were 2,553,258 bushels, as against 2,221,628 bushels on Dec. 18 and 1,068,000 bushels a year ago.

Receipts of wheat at Minneapolis and Duluth today, 220 cars, as against 353 cars the corresponding day of last year.

The imports of wheat into Liverpool last week were 35,000 tons, as against 33,000 tons the week before.

Brattleboro's Atlantic indicators wheat cost of the Rockies increased 1,647,000 bushels; in Europe, decreased 2,400,000 bushels; the world, decreased 738,000 bushels; corn increased 670,000 bushels, and oats decreased 100,000 bushels.
