There have been no specially new features in general trade conditions at Montreal since a week ago. The the season is now well advanced towards midsummer, the movement in general hardware, metals, oils, paints, etc., is well sustained, and grocerymen appear well satisfied with the volume of business in progress. In dry goods this is a "'tween season" period, and the attention of wholesalers is still directed to the completion of the semi-annual stocktaking. Some travelers are aiready out with pretty fully assorted fall samples, but few orders have been booked as yet. Leather still rules quiet, but boot and shoe orders are said to be coming very fairly, and manufacturers in that line are beginning to make rather more inquiries for stock, the their actual purchases are yet small. General satisfaction seems to pravail with, regard to collections, and failures of any significance are noticeably absent. Six small insolvencies are reported in the district for the week, the largest with liabilities of about \$7000. In values in Belgium. 
