### GOURAUD'S ARMY CAPTURES HUNS TO THE EAST OF THE RIVER AISNE With the French Army on the Aisne, Friday, Nov. 1.-Gen. Gouraud's troops

made important progress east of the River Aisne today. They captured several hundred prisoners, batteries of three-inch and four-inch guns. The concentric movement of troops advancing northward from the region of Olizy and Beaureparie and eastward from the line of the bend in the Aisne has tightened their grip on the wooded region northwest of Grandpre. The forces advancing northward have reached the spur east of Trimat and the Broye Farm, one thousand yards north of Beaureparie, while those advancing eastward from the Aisne have occupied the villages of Rilly-aux-Oles, Somuy and Voncg, north of Vouziers, and Falaise, to the southeast.

The enemy's resistance has been particularly energetic east of Vouzieres where he has been able to utilize the cover of the wooded region for his characteristic bush fighting. French troops have made satisfactory gains in that region, however, holding at last accounts the Wagnierie Plateau, the Malva Farm, Hill 193 and the southern branch of the Chalon rivulet.
