Many Women Got Six Baskets For \$1.25, Delivered.

Tomatoes were plentiful on the market today at 25 to 30 cents per basket. Many women got six baskets for \$1.25, and from the baskets there is an active demand for tomatoes, and they are coming in in large quantities.

Crabapples made their first appearance and sold at 50 cents for eleven quarts. Quality is fair to good.

Elderberries also were on the market for the first time and found a ready sale at 25 cents per bushel. Some were asking 20 cents, but this price was not paid.

Six-quart baskets of grapes came down to 50 cents. The former quotations were from 60 to 60 cents.
