

More Bullish Crop Advices And Wheat Market Goes Higher

Reports From Canadian West Discouraging and Winnipeg Market Develops Strength—Liverpool Cables Easier.

Visible Supply.
Bradstreet's estimate of the world's visible supply of wheat decreased 1,700,000 bushels, and corn decreased 847,000 bushels, and oats decreased 364,000 bushels. European visible wheat, decrease 1,200,000 bushels.

Crop Reports.
Lewis wire from Winnipeg: The general accepted crop of the Canadian West in 1909 was 90 million for Saskatchewan, 45 million in Manitoba, and 3 million in Alberta, but I find the actual production in these three provinces in 1909 was 118 million. This year the acreage is estimated at 6,450,000 v. 7,150,000 last year, and the probable yield this year is ten million for Manitoba, fifty-five to sixty for Saskatchewan, and two million for Alberta. Live elevators here say half their country houses in Southern Manitoba won't be opened this season. You must bear in mind the large acreage in Manitoba is in the south half.
J. P. Bickell & Co.: It looks like 10,000,000 bushels for Canada and 35,000,000 for North Dakota, and 26,000,000 bushels for South Dakota.
Leont wire from Brandon: "Southern Manitoba light and will not make over one-half crop of wheat. From Estevan to Souris very poor, and has not responded to rain."

Foreign Crops.
J. P. Bickell & Co. furnish the following crop summary as it appears in Broomfield's Corn Trade News:
United Kingdom: The weather during the past five days has been warm, which is raising hopes of early harvesting. Cereals are ripe, and it is expected to be about ten days. The yield is expected to be about that of last year.
France: There has been continual heavy rains, which has caused floods, and fears are expressed of partial to heavy losses. In the early part, however, of fine weather, fair harvest results are possible and render the imports of foreign grain unnecessary.
Germany: There have been heavy general rains during the earlier part of the week, which is damaging the growing crop, but a late rain, which has improved the weather has improved the cutting of the rice crop has commenced.
Italy: Harvesting is progressing actively. An official report states that an average crop is indicated, with the exception of the Province of Abruzzo, where the crop is poor. The quality of the new wheat is generally superior to the Spain. The weather is unsettled, but at present no material damage has taken place.
Turkey: Heavy loss to the crops by floods in confirmed. Harvesting is about completed.
Algeria: Threshing is progressing actively, and yields are good.
Russia: Tropical heat prevails in the south and there are complaints of a shrivelled plant. Drought prevails in the north. Stocks at the ports are decreasing.
Bulgaria: Harvesting is progressing rapidly and good yields are reported.
Hungary: Harvesting is about finished with the weather favorable and yields are generally good.
Austria and Bohemia: There have been continued heavy rains and dry weather is urgently needed.
India: It is officially announced that the monsoon has broken, and as a result, the rice crop is free with the markets weak.
