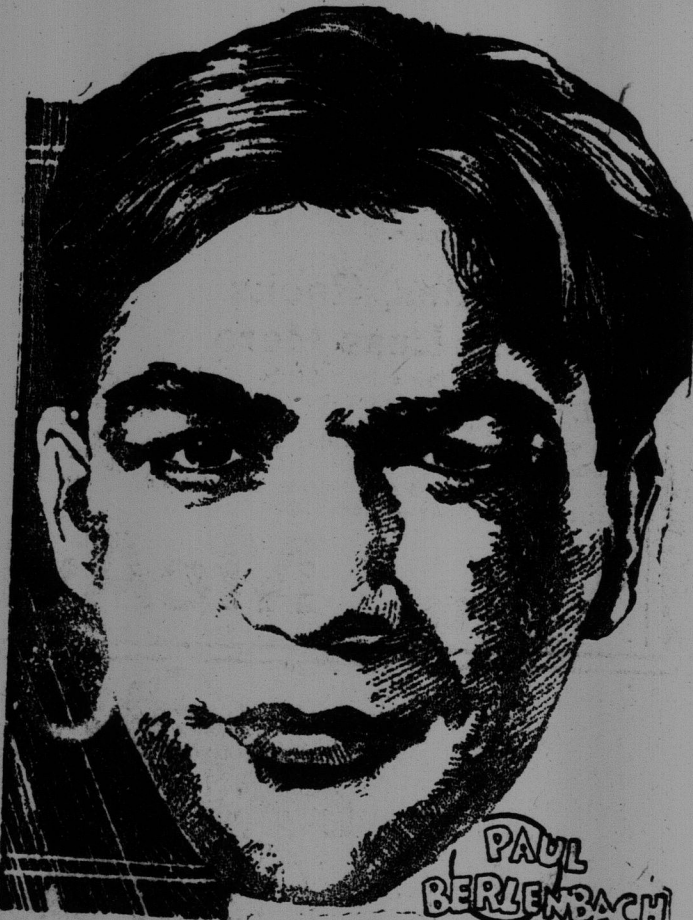
### PRELIMINARY BOUTS

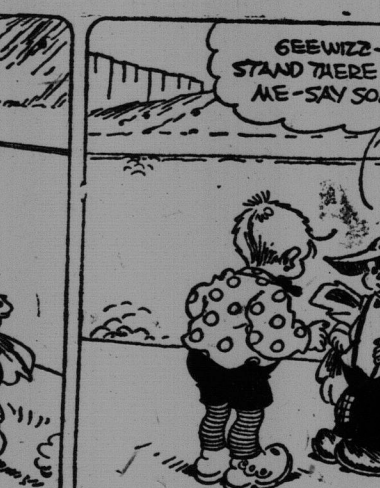

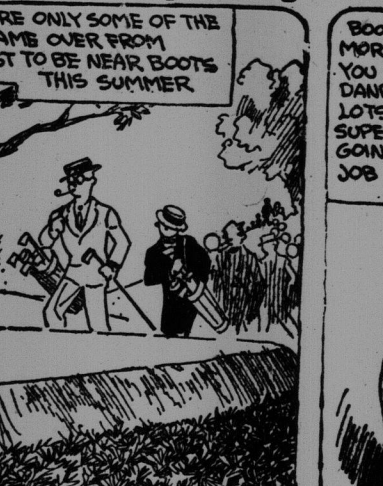
