HEAR MEMBERS OF GOVERNMENT

Ludlow Street Brotherhood Addressed by Premier and Hon. Mr. Tilley.

Lt. Col. G. G. Corbett Also Speaks at Anniversary of Church Organization.

The Men's Brotherhood of the Ludlow Street Baptist church observed its fourteenth anniversary at a special service last night when Hon. Dr. J. B. M. Baxter, Premier of New Brunswick; Hon. L. P. D. Tilley and Lieut. Colonel G. G. Corbett, gave brief addresses. The anniversary observance will be continued with a social to be held on Thursday evening of this week when Rev. H. Boyer will be the speaker. There was a large congregation last evening. S. H. Mayes led the singing.

George Ring, president of the class, led the opening devotion and T. B. Brown and Deacon Ring also took part. Rev. W. A. Robbins, the pastor, presided for the remainder of the service.

PREMIER BAXTER.

The Premier based his remarks on the words of Cecil Rhodes, "So little done, so much to do." He recalled the famous memorial he had seen on his recent visit to England and said that while many had commemorated great heroes who had mightily achieved, the cenotaph had commemorated the great struggling mass of the people whose concentrated effort had saved the day. He urged the members of the Brotherhood to united effort, saying they would always find work to do at their own door. Although Saint John was a good city compared to many, he said there was still poverty and still shame to be found here and therefore still work was readily at hand.

Mr. Tilley addressed himself chiefly to the young men, giving them sound advice and exhorting them to be honest in all things. He spoke of the church as the safeguard of the nation and declared money and ability to do little worth if sound character did not go with them. He urged all the men of the congregation to join the Brotherhood.

Lieut. Col. Dr. G. G. Corbett spoke of his long interest in the Brotherhood and referred to those who had passed away from its ranks and of the need to have others come up to fill the gaps in the ranks. He described the Brotherhood as a group of men having a common interest in the redemption of the world and in the redemption of the world among nations. He trusted the day would soon come when there would be universal brotherhood on the earth.

Mr. Robbins extended thanks to the speakers. Miss M. E. Mullin was at the organ and during the service the quartette, "When Storms Around Are Sweeping," was sung by Ralph Rupert, Prescott McLean, Miss Louise Burke and Miss Carrie Durkee. The duet, "Drifting," was sung by Miss Durkee and Miss Burke.

Two Bishops Take Part In Ceremony

BATHURST, Oct. 18.—A triduum in honor of the canonization of St. John Eudes, founder of the Eudist Fathers, was begun today at the Church of The Holy Family, West Bathurst. His Lordship Bishop Leonard, of Rimouski, Que., celebrated pontifical high mass, and his Lordship Bishop Chasson, of Chatham, preached an eloquent sermon on the Life and Works of the Saint with special reference to his piety, eloquence and scholarship.

QUEBEC, Oct. 18.—The first withdrawals in the 1925 federal election campaign in Quebec district took place today when Dr. Gauthier, who was an independent Conservative in Gaspé county, and R. Beaudoin, who was standing as an independent Liberal in Beauce county, both announced their retirement.

Meighen Ends His Prairie Campaign

WINNIPEG, Oct. 18.—Forty-five speeches in 18 days is the record of Right Hon. Arthur Meighen's campaign tour in the West, which came to an end last night.

Since his meetings at the head of the lakes at the end of September the Conservative leader has spoken that number of speeches at public meetings besides brief addresses at party gatherings and women's organization rallies.

GOVERNOR BUYS SOFT COAL.

BOSTON, Oct. 18.—Governor Alvan T. Fuller has hurried the defiance gauntlet at the anthracite interests by having 30 tons of hard coal taken out of his cellar to be replaced by bituminous. The governor urged the public to "strike off the shackles of bondage," placed upon them by the hard coal industry, has announced the shipment of a train load of soft coal to New England.

JAPAN ERECTS GREAT NEW PARLIAMENT ON FIRE RUINS



A great new home for parliament of modern, and probably Occidental architecture, is being planned by the Japanese Government to replace the frame Imperial diet buildings destroyed by fire. The house of peers is seen a mass of flames, with sparks igniting its brother house of parliament and spreading over a section of Tokyo, while firemen, soldiers and civilians battle it futilely.

Cattle Shipments To Exceed 100,000

OTTAWA, Oct. 18.—This year's cattle shipments from Canada to the United Kingdom will considerably exceed 100,000 head.

While the British demand is at present easing off somewhat, the total for 1925 will be a record-breaker, the monthly average being well over 10,000.

In money the year's total will be about the \$12,000,000 mark. It is still impossible to get the port of London open to the transportation of cattle from Canada. The Admiralty some time ago took over control of certain wharves not then required for other purposes, so that there is no wharfage now available for the discharging of Canadian cattle.

ST. MARY'S TO MONCTON.

St. Mary's Band, at full strength, will leave by special train tomorrow afternoon for Moncton where the band will give a special concert for the C. N. R. radio. J. Ernest Till, tenor soloist, goes with the band and will give four special numbers in the concert.

JUDGMENT LATER

Evidence Says P. C. Larkin Gets \$369,907 Dividends, \$25,000 Salary.

TORONTO, Oct. 18.—Judgment was reserved on the appeal to the Court of Revision by Hon. P. C. Larkin, Canadian High Commissioner, in London, against assessment of his income at \$369,907.

Evidence was given by an official of the Salada Tea Company that Mr.

Larkin owned all but five shares of the company, and drew \$369,907 in dividends, these being paid in London. Mr. Larkin also receives a salary of \$25,000 as president of the company, but no appeal was made against assessment in regard to this amount.

CARS COLLIDE

WAREHOUSE AT SYDNEY ROBBED

Thieves Cut 10 to 15 Kegs of Liquor From Excise Stores.

Family Sleeping on Floor Above Fail to Hear Thieves at Work.

SYDNEY, N.S., Oct. 18.—In a daring raid at the Government excise warehouse, George street, in the heart of the business district, some time between midnight and 5 o'clock this morning, "booze burglars" got away with between ten and fifteen 10-gallon kegs of seized contraband liquor, valued locally at \$10 per gallon. Access to the building was gained by boring a hole through a side door and lifting off a bar.

The warehouse floor and the basement are used jointly by the customs authorities and the city, as a storehouse for captured liquor. City Inspector McEae was in the building depositing the proceeds of a raid on a local bootlegger at about 11:30 Saturday night and states that he left everything in order.

DISCOVERED AT 5 A. M.

The robbery was discovered at 5 o'clock this morning by a man employed in a garage across the street who, noting the door open, notified the police. The city seizures are stored in a separate room of the building under locks and nothing was missing.

The government liquor was stored in the basement and the thieves evidently worked very quietly while getting their booty to the ground floor and to a waiting motor truck, as a family living in the second floor of the building were not disturbed.

Raymond Higgins Shoots Two Bears

The skins of two rangers bears, a male and a female, said to be the first shot in the district around Sherwood Lake, near Westfield, in the last thirty years, were brought to the city on Saturday by Raymond L. Higgins, 4 Bryden street, who had been in the woods hunting for only a few days before bagging the animals.

This young sportsman, 18 years of age, has made quite a reputation for himself with a gun, getting a moose last year and capturing the two big bears on this trip. The female measured more than six and one-half feet in length, the male being a little smaller. One old hunter who saw the skins, declared that the animals were the first of their particular kind seen or shot in the Sherwood Lake district for thirty years.

Ludendorff Saved From Communists

BRESLAU, Germany, Oct. 18.—General Ludendorff, former first quartermaster-general, and in March last badly defeated as the National-

ist candidate for the presidency of Germany, addressed an extreme Nationalist meeting here today, and almost came to grief, when on proceeding to his automobile he found himself surrounded by vast crowds of Communists, who threatened violence. Quick action by the police prevented serious trouble.

HARVARD BEATS OXFORD.

BOSTON, Oct. 18.—Harvard defeated Oxford in debate here, the Harvard students upholding the negative of the proposition that the growth and activities of the Socialist movement are detrimental to social progress. The audience voted 837 to 691.
