DINGLEY TODAY IS WINDING UP SEASON

Steamship Brought Some 11,000 People Here This Year

The Eastern Steamship liner Governor Dingley will sail for Boston this evening on her last trip of the season from here. She started her spring schedule on May 20 and since that time has made two round trips a week between this port and Boston, leaving here on Wednesday mornings via Eastport and Lunenburg on Saturday evenings direct to Boston. The passenger and freight travel this year compared favorably with 1924. The approximate number of people arriving here on the steamship during the season was 11,000, and 12,000 departed for Boston. The Dingley will not arrive until about 4 o'clock this afternoon.


