ECHO OF TRAIN ROBBERY

Petition for Distribution of Recovered \$60,000

Quebec, Feb. 3.—At the next term of the Criminal Assizes, petition will be filed before the presiding judge, asking for the return to a number of guarantee insurance companies interested a sum of \$60,000 which was left in the custody of the Provincial Treasurer's Department, after having been recovered from the Montserrat Ocean Limited, holdup last year. The amount, which represented money belonging to various banks, was placed before the court when the famous case was heard, and recently a petition was made to Chief Justice Lachance of the Court of Session, who denied his authority to adjudge on the matter, and Mr. Ernest Lapointe, K. C., acting on behalf of the insurance companies, has decided to appeal directly to the criminal court.

RELIGIONS IN ARMY.

London, Feb. 3.—A new army order amends the king's regulations regarding the classification of religious denominations in the army by providing that a soldier will be classified for all purposes, in accordance with his own declaration on the subject, under one of the following denominations:—Church of England, Presbyterian (including Church of Scotland, United Free Church of Scotland, Free Church of Scotland, Presbyterian Church of Ireland, and Welsh Calvinistic Methodist), Roman Catholic, Wesleyan, Baptist, Congregationalist, Primitive Methodist, United Methodist, Jewish, or other denomination as stated by the soldier.

FORCED CREW TO LEAVE VESSEL

Arrests Follow Interference
Over Matter of Seamen's
Wages.

New Orleans, Feb. 3.—Federal authorities here yesterday arrested James Jacobson, delegate of the Seamen's Union, and three other men on charges of interfering with U. S. commerce by inducing a vessel and removing the crew.

It is alleged that the men directed a force of twenty-five armed men who boarded the U. S. schooner Edith yesterday, as it was about to sail for Havana with a cargo of lumber, and forced the crew to leave the vessel. It is difficult to obtain berths, they had shipped at less than union rates.

The crew, according to the authorities, were kept under armed guard for several hours in a room adjoining the headquarters of the Seamen's Union before they were set at liberty. The Edith sailed yesterday with a crew and the four arrested were remanded to prison in default of \$1,000 bail in each case.

Ottawa, Feb. 2.—An order-in-council has been passed cancelling the contract between the government and Griffiths and associates for the reorganization of the civil service. The firm, which is given sixty days of grace, was appointed to reorganize the service on June 1.

Ottawa, Ont., Feb. 2.—Notices of resolutions calling for a return to the system of political patronage in appointments to the civil service and for the establishment of an imperial parliament representing every portion of the empire will be presented to the House of Commons by Sir Sam Hughes, Minister of the Interior, and also given notice of a resolution calling for the establishment of a federal housing board to supervise the expenditure of ten millions dollars to be appropriated annually for five years to buy land and build houses for any thrifty Canadian citizen who can make an initial payment and make monthly payments agreed upon.

ACQUITTED AFTER THE JURY PRAYED

Foreman, a Minister, says He
Had Vision As He Prayed

Kansas City, Feb. 3.—A jury in the circuit court here yesterday prayed and then returned a verdict acquitting W. V. Spencer on a charge of murder. Spencer killed Elmer Penner during a fight in a rooming house. His plea was self-defense. Later the foreman of the jury, J. E. Foulkes, an ordained minister, explained that as he prayed, the principals of the killing appeared before him in a vision. Spencer, he said, was surrounded with a bright glow while Penner appeared in darkness. "Then it was decided that darkness was not for truth," said Foulkes. The vision appeared to him, Foulkes said, after the first ballot. When the second ballot was taken, he said, the verdict was for acquittal.
