CRICKET.

A schedule was drawn up and by-laws framed at the meeting of the St. John Soccer Football Club executive which took place in the Y. M. C. A. last night. Two series, a spring and an autumn one, will be played and the winners of the series will play off for the league leadership. It is expected that during the season games will be held with outside teams. The first four games are scheduled as follows: May 12, Central A. C. vs. Carleton Football club; May 16, Military vs. Hardware Clerks; May 19, Hardware Clerks vs. Carleton, and May 22, C. A. C. vs. Military. These games in all probability will be played at the Shamrock grounds beginning at 6.45 p. m. No admission will be charged. The other games on the schedule will be announced when the place they are to be played is ascertained.

ATHLETICS.

Twenty-one medals have been donated by the commission for the seven championship events of the Ontario school games at St. Catharines on May 27. WRESTLING.

Zyzsko Now Champion
New York, May 6.—Stanislaus Zyzsko of Poland won the world's heavyweight catch-as-catch-can wrestling championship here tonight by defeating Ed (Strangler) Lewis of San Jose (Cal.), with a neck lock after twenty-three minutes of wrestling.

WRESTLING.

After minutes of strenuous grappling, Lewis tried for his famous headlock and missed, falling on his back. The Pole quickly pounced upon him and flung his shoulders to the mat. Zyzsko weighed 220 pounds and Lewis 225. The official time was twenty-three minutes and seventeen seconds.

The quick finish came as a surprise to the spectators, who apparently looked for a long, hard contest.

Both wrestlers were in excellent condition. They indulged in rough tactics from the start, but in the first twenty minutes, neither seemed to have the advantage.

Lewis tried for a toe hold in the first ten minutes but without success. Zyzsko entered the ring in his bare feet and Lewis wore the regulation wrestling shoes.

While the men were struggling for an advantageous hold, Zyzsko rolled off the mat. Under the rules both wrestlers had to come to the centre of the mat again and take a standing position.

WRESTLING.

In the encounter that followed, Zyzsko got out of a half-Nelson and broke away from a body scissors. He then secured a combination toe and crotch, and Lewis wriggled out of it. They were tossing each other about the ring when Lewis got a head scissors, holding it for more than half a minute.

Lewis then tried a flying headlock and missed. His arm slipped over Zyzsko's perspiring neck and head and the force of his plunge carried him to the floor. He fell on his back to the mat. Zyzsko then pounced on him, threw the weight of his body on Lewis' chest, locked his
