NEW TERMS OF THE LIQUOR ACT IN MANITOBA

(Canadian Press.)
Winnipeg, March 8—By a bill amending the Manitoba temperance act, which was distributed in the house yesterday afternoon, government vendors are authorized to purchase or sell liquor, and it is stipulated they must not sell more than five callons a day to a licensee or than five gallons a day to a licensee or retail druggist.
