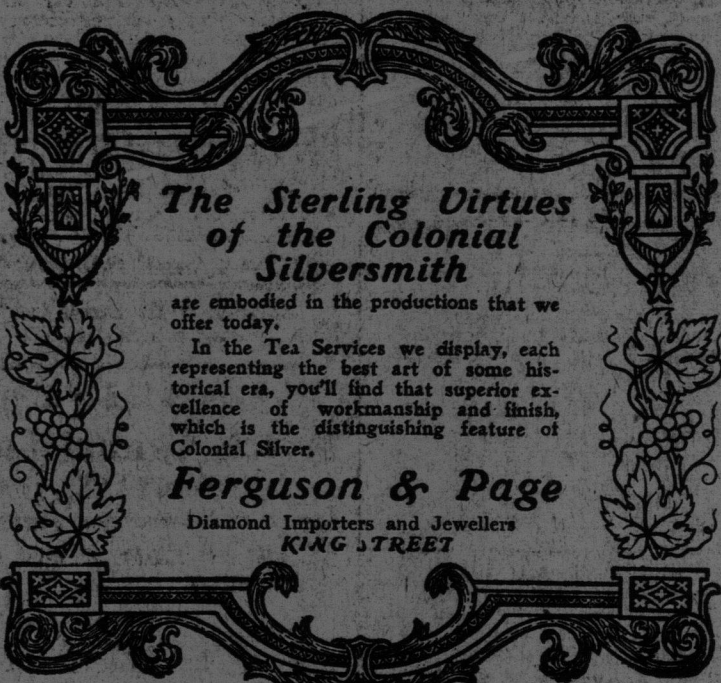

MAY ESTABLISH NEW LABOR PAPER IN THIS CITY

Alleged unsafe conditions in the construction of the new post office were referred to at the meeting of the Trades and Labor Council held in Oddfellows hall last evening with James J. Sugrue, president, in the chair. It was decided to ask the building inspector to see that the workmen were properly protected by the placing of boards across the girders, if this was not being done as was desired was the case. It was also decided to ask for an

amendment to the health act requiring that all thicknesses of old paper be removed from dwelling houses to prevent the retention of disease germs. The president reported on his visit to Fredericton and the legislation in which the laboring men were interested. Mr. Buchanan, of Moncton, was heard with reference to the establishment of a labor paper as a successor to the Eastern Labor News, the new journal to be published in this city.

ASK FOR DRASTIC CHANGES IN THE LIQUOR LAW

Provincial Branch of Dominion Alliance Will Not Demand Prohibition at Present—Some of the Desired Amendments

Fredericton, March 19.—New Brunswick branch of the Dominion Temperance Alliance met in annual session here today. Officers were elected as follows: President, C. W. Weyman, Sussex; first vice-president, J. Willard Smith, St. John; second vice-president, Rev. Dr. W. H. Smith, Fredericton; third vice-president, L. R. Hetherington, Newcastle; treasurer, A. C. M. The amendments are to give officers of the law a right to seize liquor at railway stations, or while in transit on highways; to enable license inspectors to engage special counsel if the county clerk is unable to appear for the presentation in any case; to compel drunken men under threat of imprisonment, to tell where they obtained liquor; to make it possible to bring action against persons shipping liquor into a prohibited district; to empower officers to destroy liquor which is without

owner; to provide a penalty for shipping liquor under false designation and labels; to provide penalty for shipping liquor to fictitious persons. The meeting also adopted a recommendation to attempt to secure the nomination and election of parliamentary representatives in sympathy with the views and aims of the alliance by having members enter into primary organization of political parties; also to establish branches throughout various counties, where they may be considered necessary.

R. S. Hensinger, of St. John, a prominent worker in the Sons of Temperance, protested strongly against the adoption of the latter on the ground that the establishment of alliance branches in smaller places throughout the province would be detrimental to the existing temperance organizations. Reports of Field Secretary R. H. Shaver and Treasurer A. C. M. Lawson were received and adopted.

The executive of alliance has decided that it would not be advisable to ask the provincial government to enact a prohibitory law for the province. F. S. Spence, of Toronto, dominion president of the alliance, addressed the New Brunswick branch this afternoon and tonight addressed a public meeting in the Opera House upon the general advance of temperance throughout Canada.

ST. JOHN BILLS ARE AGREED TO AT FREDERICTON

Fredericton, March 19.—The house met at 4:30 p. m.

Mr. Munroe presented the report of the municipalities committee.

Mr. Slipp presented the report of the corporations committee.

Mr. Guitrie presented a petition in favor of a bill to incorporate the St. John D. Impresario Du Madwaka.

Mr. Dugal gave notice of inquiry in regard to amount of road taxes paid to the secretary of each municipality and to the department of public works and with regard to amount spent on roads and bridges; as to whether Quebec and St. John Railway Company had applied for further assistance in building the Valley Railway and as to the assurances given by the premier or any member of the government to a delegation from the parish of Westfield with regard to diverting the route of the Y. & N. railway so as to cross the Kennebecasis at or near Barlow's bluff.

It was agreed to pass bills to enable the town of Sussex to lease debentures to amend the St. John assessment act of 1909; and to amend the act relating to the government of streets in St. John. Acts were passed incorporating the New Brunswick Hydro-Electric Company and the Cape Breton Temperance and Public Hall Company.

Hon. Mr. Clarke introduced a bill amending the judicature act 1909 and act in amendment thereof.
