ENFRANCHISEMENT OF MEN FROM DOMINION

House of Lords Proposed Giving Overseas Men in England a Ballot in English Elections

London, Feb. 7.—An interesting debate took place in the House of Commons last night respecting an amendment inserted by the House of Lords into the new electoral bill, which would have had the effect of including in the franchise Dominion soldiers serving in England.

Mr. H. H. St. John, late postmaster-general, pointed out that any Canadian soldier who had been here six months would, as the bill stood, be enfranchised, and would even have ballot papers sent them if in France. If English soldiers were quartered in Canada for six months would the Dominion government give them a Dominion vote?

Mr. H. H. St. John thought that as a Canadian, who happened to be training here, he was entitled to elect a prohibition candidate, although the English electors held very different views. He asked, "Would it really prove a negation of representative government, creating bad feeling instead of good?"

Mr. Fisher thought that the clause merely desired to cover soldiers and sailors resident here, but who were paid by the dominions. He saw now this little parcel was perhaps turning into a big tub.

Eventually the clause was referred back for reconsideration, the understanding being that the commons would welcome a clause enfranchising dominion soldiers mainly residing here.

TEMPORARY WITHDRAWAL OF EXPRESS TRAINS NOS. 7 AND 8 BETWEEN NEW GLASGOW AND SYDNEY

Temporary withdrawal of express trains Nos. 7 and 8 between New Glasgow and Sydney. As a result of the explosion at Stellarton Mines and consequent loss of supply of coal from that source the greater demand from the Cape Breton mines has so increased the rail traffic that it has been found necessary to temporarily curtail the passenger service between New Glasgow and Sydney. In order to facilitate the coal movement express trains Nos. 7 and 8 will be temporarily discontinued between New Glasgow and Sydney, the last trip of No. 7 leaving New Glasgow for Sydney will be midnight Saturday, Feb. 9, and No. 8 leaving Sydney for New Glasgow at 10.30 p. m. Sunday, Feb. 10. These trains will continue to run on their regular schedule between New Glasgow and Halifax. It is expected the full service will be restored about Feb. 20.

UNITED STATES AND CANADA MAY JOIN IN DAYLIGHT SAVING PLAN

An Ottawa despatch states that by co-operation between United States and Canada there will probably this summer be a continental daylight saving scheme. These schemes have been tried in different communities for the last two years, but it is recognised that national or continental co-operation is necessary.

FAMOUS SWIMMER COMING

Miss Fanny Durack of Australia To Visit America

New York, Feb. 6.—Miss Fanny Durack, of Australia, considered the greatest swimmer of her sex in the world, will visit this country next summer. Passage for herself and Mrs. Marc Chambers, secretary of the Ladies' Amateur Swimming Association of New South Wales, has been booked on the steamship Sonoma, which leaves Sydney May 15, and is due in San Francisco on June 8.

Miss Durack will make her American debut on June 6, at a meet to be held for the purpose in the big open air pond at Stanford University. Her schedule to 16, several water carnivals at Neptune Beach, Alameda; June 21, Sacramento; June 22, Stockholm; June 23, San Jose; June 28, Piedmont; June 29, Fresno; June 30, Bakers Field; July 1, San Diego; July 8 and 9, Los Angeles; July 14, Yosemite Valley; 16 to 30, meets in San Francisco, Oakland, and Alameda; August 4, Portland, Ore.; August 10, Seattle; August 15, Vancouver, B. C.

The fair Australian is expected to make an eastern tour, arrangements for which are now under way, and to take part in several meets in and about New York.

William Unack, of San Francisco, who was instrumental in bringing about the champion's trip, has obtained her consent to deliver lectures on swimming to high school girls. It is her aim to make the lectures educational, laying stress on the benefits to be derived physically and mentally from the practice of the art of natation.

The trip of the Sydney mermaid stands out as a feature of the year in aquatic, for it will afford the fair home stars their first opportunity to make a bid for international laurels in actual contest. Miss Durack has reigned supreme ever since she made an almost clean sweep at the Olympic games of 1912 in Stockholm.
