SPECIAL ELECTION

Re Building District By-Law

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that a Special Election will be held in the City of Saint John on TUESDAY, the twenty-sixth day of August instant, when the following By-Law will be submitted to the vote of the Electors of the said City.

A Law to Further Amend the Laws relating to the Construction of Buildings in the City of Saint John.

WHEREAS, by an act of the General Assembly, passed on the Twentieth day of March, A.D. 1913, entitled "An Act for the Better Prevention of Conflagrations in the City of Saint John," the Common Council of the City of Saint John was authorized, from time to time, by By-Law or Ordinance, to alter the Districts into which the City is divided by the Act 41, Vic. c. 6, as amended by the Act 1, Edward 7, c. 68, and make new districts in lieu thereof.

Be it ordained by the City of Saint John, in Common Council convened, as follows:

1. Instead of the boundaries given for the First District in Section 1 of said Act, 41st Vic. c. 6, the following boundaries are substituted therefor, and the territory therein comprised shall be the First District:

First District, within the lines and bounds next mentioned and described, that is to say: Beginning on the Harbour Line, established by law in 1868, where the extension westerly of the southerly line of Union Street would strike the same; thence due north until it strikes a prolongation westerly of the line of the middle of North Street in the eastern line of the said Chipman property, where the middle line of Carleton Street would strike the same; thence westerly along the said middle line of Carleton Street to a point fifty (50) feet eastward of the easterly line of Carleton Street; th
