

## PRINCE TO GIVE CUP TO WINNER OF ANGLO-

London, Oct. 10—It is rumored that Prince Henry of Prussia, who has been touring in a motor car through Great Britain, and who paid a visit recently to his cousin, King George, at Balmoral, conceived the idea of an Anglo-German motor contest, and it is understood that the details of the contest, which is to take place at the time of the coronation of King George next year, are now being considered. It is understood that Prince Henry intends to present a cup to those cars which cover the route with the fewest number of stoppages owing to defective machinery, punctures, etc.

Unlike the contest held a few years ago, when numbers of racing inotor cars rushed along the highroad, this proposed Anglo-German contest is to be carried out along thoroughly practical and utilitarian lines. It is expected that the trip will last about a fortnight, and that the route selected will be through the most interesting and picturesque parts of the country.
