BISHOP NOT CHOSEN YET. Dr. H. G. Cody Elected But Will Not Accept. Further Ballotting May be Postponed Until September.

HALIFAX, N. S., June 26.—Rev. Dr. H. G. Cody of Toronto, on the eleventh ballot, was, on Saturday evening, elected Bishop of Nova Scotia by the Diocesan Synod, which met for the purpose...

It is likely that at this meeting a committee will be appointed to select a name that will probably prove acceptable to the Synod, and that an adjournment will then be made till September to act upon the committee report and proceed with a new election.

Rev. W. J. Ancient moved an adjournment till 8 o'clock to allow a conference of clergy and laity. Judge Fitzgerald thought such a conference would not be of advantage at that stage of the proceeding.

RUSSIANS VAINLY ATTEMPT TO CHECK JAPANESE ADVANCE. Continual Harassing of the Column Resulted in Loss of Almost a Hundred Men Including Many Officers.

ST. PETERSBURG, June 27.—The general staff has received the following despatch from Lieut. General Sakharoff, dated June 26: "There is reason to suppose that a considerable force of the enemy proceeded from the Wangtasia station in the direction of the mountains, marching northward toward the Chahan Pass."

"At 10.30 a. m. the cavalry of our advance guard drove the enemy from the trenches of their advanced position. At 1.20 p. m. four Russian guns of the mountain horse artillery had been placed in position against the enemy's right flank, which they bombarded with great success, the right column retiring. The serried ranks of the Japanese troops developed a violent fusillade, which, however, was silenced without result."

BROOKLYN TRAGEDY. NEW YORK, June 28.—Five persons were drowned in the bay off 47th street, Brooklyn, by the overturning of the 38-foot sloop yacht Elele and Katie in a heavy storm that swept over New York this afternoon.
