is an illusion. The American people are on the whole more patient and calm than Europeans. Hospital reports showing increases in nervous diseases, are like reports of appendicitis, a matter of nomenclature. The true evil is "the weakness of attention," and that is a bad habit rather than a disease. There is a lack of thoroughness, an unwillingness to concentrate attention, which is greater in America than elsewhere, and greater now than formerly. The great function of education, which is to secure mental energy and concentration, has been neglected in favor of mechanical training, electivism in college, and kindergarten methods. Work has become irritating because men have not learned the joy of it. Prohibitions are found necessary because there is no training in self-control. There is no increase in nervousness.
