**FIVE FAMILIES  
WERE BURNED OUT**  
Tenement House on Brussels  
Street Badly Gutted by Fire  
Yesterday Morning—Slight  
Fire in Carleton Street  
Garage.  
Five families were turned out of  
their homes yesterday morning when  
fire destroyed the two and a half story  
house at 252 Brussels street owned by  
Charles Brager. The fire was first  
noticed about five o'clock by Leo Con-  
way, the seven-year-old son of Charles  
Conway, who gave the alarm, and his  
parents were enabled to get out in  
their night clothes. None of the ten-  
ants were able to get out, their  
household effects, the fire having made  
such headway before it was discov-  
ered. The tenants were J. Jeffries,  
who conducted a grocery store on the  
lower floor; Thomas Earle and Joseph  
Deuce, on the second floor, and  
Charles Conway and Mr. Chapman, on  
the top floor. Mr. Jeffries had a small  
amount of insurance on his stock, but  
none of the other tenants carried any  
insurance. The building was partially  
insured by the Fidelity Fire Co.

Yesterday afternoon an alarm from  
box 18 called the firemen to Carleton  
street for a slight fire in a garage. The  
blaze was extinguished before any dam-  
age was done.

on October 12th next.


