I shall bring to the attention of my colleagues at the first opportunity the statement contained in your letter of the 18th instant, received this morning, with respect to the work of the International Catalogue of Scientific Literature, and your appeal that the Government should appropriate an amount for its support, as was done each year from 1913 to 1919, with the single exception of 1914.

I can only assure you at the moment that the representations you have made as to the character of the work which is being undertaken, and the need for its continued maintenance, will receive the very careful consideration of the Government.
