

106 Ontario Scholars in Mississauga, Pt. Credit S'ville

MISSISSAUGA — More than 100 Grade 13 students in Mississauga, Port Credit and Streetsville graduated this year with an 80 percent (or more) average and qualified as Ontario Scholars. They each receive \$150 from the provincial government.

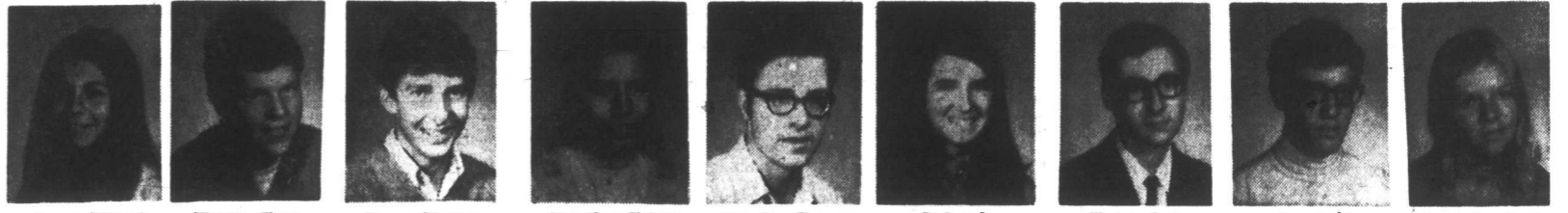
Lorne Park Secondary School led the list with 26 scholars.

Peel County Board of Education officials declined to reveal the top student in this area. Since Grade 13 final departmental examinations were abolished a year ago, there is no accurate method of determining top marks or means of comparison, they claimed.

However, Streetsville Secondary School reported that their best student marks were earned by Miss Penny Rose with an average of 94.6 percent and Miss Jean Mary Lashley of Erindale Secondary School earned a 93.4 percent average.

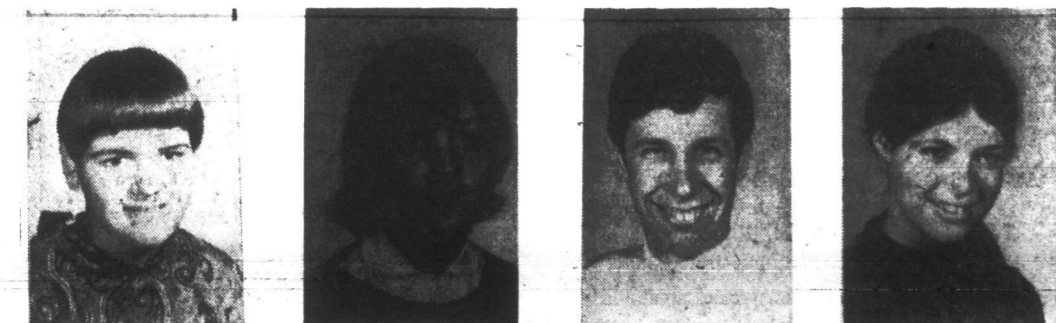

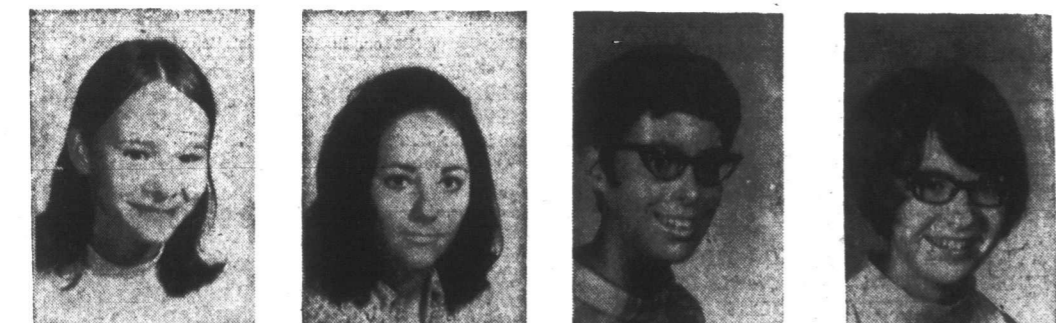
