Sir,

Thave the honor to inform you that a letter has been received from Met arthur Peake of Midnapore complaining of the manner in which he is treated by Sarcee Indiaus living upon the Reserve near his homestead in 1p. 22. Pauge 2 Sec. 34. Up. Peake complains that during his absences from home, the Indiaus have broken with his house and taken things away which cannot be replaced. That they frequently cut his stock loose from the pickets, and on one occasion they cut his harness nearly all to pieces.

He further states that he has always treated them well, fed them to. Thindly deport on this and endeavour

to restrain the Indeaus from committing the trespasses complained of.
