In reply to your letter of the 6th instant I have to say that it would be preferable for you to apply to the Department of Lands, Forests & Mines Toronto for such copies of the field-notes of the original survey of the Township of Gibson, which you may require.


It is especially desired that in re-tracing the boundaries of the Gibson Reserve that no action of any nature is taken that would leave any cause hereafter for dispute. You should therefore renew only those lot posts which you find in a badly decayed condition or of whose exact locality you are certain. At the road allowances it would be well to renew all the posts as the intersection of the two lines of blazes will probably enable you to find the original position of each post. You will understand from the foregoing that it is preferable to omit planting a post between lots if its position is at all doubtful, and time should not be lost in too great a search. Please note your proceedings in full in each case in your field-notes.
