

Ottawa, 27th May, 1891.

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Sir:-

Referring to previous correspondence had with you relative to instructions sent you sometime ago to hold an investigation into certain charges made against Mr. Indian Agent Gordon, of Strathroy, I enclose herein copy of a letter of the 22nd instant from Chief Scobie Logan of the Muncy Band, repeating some of the charges before made and intimating that Mr. Gordon had visited the Ontario Government in regard, it is presumed, to the charges against him, though it is not so stated, also that he had written a letter in a disguised hand and above a nom de plume, but which letter was easily detected by those who were familiar with his writing. You will observe also that Logan refers to the reported settlement of the case of Wilson & Peters relative to a piece of land on the Caradoc Reserve, respecting the ownership of which they were contestants, and he asks the Department not to act in this matter until after the investigation, which you are to hold, has been made.
