
Sir-

In regard to Plan and description left by you at the Department for issue of Letters Patent to Mr. Malone for a portion of land included in your purchase on the Temiscamingue Reserve, I beg to say that the Department is unable to make satisfactory location of property by this description.

There is no means of definitely fixing position of wharf, to which this description ties. The description should refer to some known point on the boundary of Lot 17, of which it is a part and you can either have this done or furnish the Department with a copy of the Plan of the new sub-division made by you after it has been registered.

I may say that the sub-division Plan should show definitely the leased portions and the portions to be patented, as arranged, and also the cemetery plot.
