



Ottawa, July 31st, 1914

Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 25th instant inquiring whether the teacher on the Curve Lake Reserve is responsible for any of the church services. In reply I beg to inform you that your appointment was made on the recommendation of the General Secretary of the Methodist Missionary Society which has the nomination of the teacher for the school on this Reserve and as there is no resident Missionary at Curve Lake, it is presumed that you were expected to take the regular church services. To satisfy yourself on this point, you should communicate with the Rev. Dr. Shore, General Secretary of the Methodist Missionary Society, Toronto, Ont.
