

levies moved to the outskirts of Myitkyina (3), harassing the foe. From the Chin Hills (4) tribal units advanced to carry on aggressive patrolling. All this prepared the way for a spectacular march by a special force that proceeded from the border of Assam across difficult country to the railroad running from Mandalay (5) to Myitkyina, which it cut at seventy-five places. Encircled by the Japanese, it fought its way out and most of it has reached safety.
