

- Q How did you come to get them ?
- A I had been rejected previously. I was A.W.L. at the time I was rejected from the Army, Sir.
- Q You say the rejection slip was dated when ?
- A 9th January, 1942.
- Q How did you get it ?
- A I voluntarily enlisted in the Active Army and was rejected, Sir.
- Q What name did you use when you applied for enlistment ?
- A My own, Sir.
- Q Did you say you had previously been called up ?
- A No, Sir, I never mentioned that.
- Q In point of fact you had already been called up and were serving as an N.R.M.A. soldier at the time you applied for enlistment, is that correct ?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q Now you say you were married in May, 1944 ?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q Where did you and your wife go to live ?
- A Central Patricia, Sir.
- Q And how long did you stay there ?
- A I stayed there until the 19th of May, Sir.
- Q 1944 ?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q And where did you go ?
- A I was apprehended there by the civilian authorities.
- Q Was it only 12 days after the date of your marriage that you were apprehended ? -- You were apprehended on the 19th of July, 1944, weren't you ?
- A Yes, Sir, it was the 19th of July. I made a slip there.
- Q Did you have a place in which to live ?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q Your wife and yourself had a place to live ?
- A Yes, Sir.
- Q How much money were you earning ?
- A Well, I was making seventy-five cents an hour plus production bonus. I didn't stop to figure out exactly what it was.
