learnt from Germany, there is nothing before us but what Mr. Belloc, the discoverer of this great sociological drift, has called the Scrvile State. And there are moods in which a man, considering that conclusion of our story, is half inclined to wish that the wave of Teutonic barbarism had washed out us and our armies together; and that the world should never know anything more of the last of the English, except that they died for liberty.
