FOREWORD.

In anticipation of a large shipment of peaches and plums to the West during 1915, the pre-cooling facilities of the Grimsby Pre-cooling and Experimental Fruit Storage warehouse have been put in the best possible shape for commercial use as well as for scientific investigations. It is expected that shippers will avail themselves of the low rates for pre-cooling made possible by the establishment of this experimental plant. The aim is to carry on the commercial work at cost and the rates have been revised with that end in view. The rules and rates herein set forth supersede and cancel those in force during the season of 1914, and it is hoped that they will meet with the approval of all prospective shippers.
