

The most fitting place of depository for such a national relic, I conceive to be the Museum of Scottish Antiquities, now permanently established in the Royal Institution at Edinburgh, under the curatorship of the Society of Antiquaries, as a National Collection. Now that King Robert's Crook has been transferred to Canada, the Scotchmen of the Province are responsible for its safety, and it would be an exceedingly graceful act of patriotism if the Scotchmen of Canada would combine to raise the requisite sum, and restore the Quirich of St. Fillan, and of THE BAUCH, to its appropriate resting-place in the Scottish Capital.

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
