THE manufacture of farm implements is an industry whose growth has a farreaching effect upon other Canadian industries, influencing the whole national life. About six times as many farm implements were imported into Canada from the United States in 1902 as were imported in 1896, the low tariff being to blame for the increase. Prices of farm implements are very much higher in free trade England than in Canada. In the United States, the most highly protected of all countries, agricultural implements are cheaper than anywhere else in the world. The reduction of the Canadian tariff on farm implements a few years ago did not cause any reduction in the price. The raising of the tariff now would cause no increase in price, but it would bring about the establishment of many new factories in Canada and the enlargement of many old ones.
