CHARLESTON. A country post office on Charleston lake, in Escott township, Leeds County, 15 miles west of Brockville, the county seat and nearest bank location, and 9 north-west of Mallorytown, on the G T Ry, its nearest railway point. Population, 100. Mail tri-weekly. P F Green, postmaster.

CHARLEVILLE. A village on Nation river in Augusta township, Grenville County, 14 miles north-west of Brockville, the county seat, and 6 north-west of Prescott, on the G T Ry, its nearest banking and railroad point. Settled in 1840. It contains Baptist and Methodist churches, and public school, and ships hay, grain, hops and produce. Stages daily to Prescott, Maynard, Centre Augusta and Throoptown. Population, 200. Mail daily. R S Throop, postmaster.

CHARLINCH. Formerly known as Ilfracombe, is a village in Stisted Township, Muskoka District, 75 miles north of Barrie, and 35 north of Gravenhurst, on the M br N & N W Rys, its nearest railway point. Nearest bank at Bracebridge. Settled in 1871. It contains an Episcopal church and a public school, and ships oats and hay. Stage to Utterson 3 times a week, fare 80c. Population, 130. Mail weekly. Wm J Fraser, postmaster.

CHATHAM. A thriving incorporated town situated at the head of navigation on the River Thames, and on McGregor's creek, which here flows into that river, and at the crossing of the G W div G T and the E & H Rys, at the intersection of the townships of Chatham, Dover, Harwich and Raleigh, in Kent County, of which it is the county seat. It is located in the centre of a rich agricultural district, was settled in 1827, and in 1840 had 800 population. Was incorporated in 1851, has made substantial progress, and has several important industries, including flour, saw and woollen mills, extensive waggon, engine and boiler works, foundries and machine shops, breweries, malt houses, etc, and contains Episcopal, Presbyterian, Methodist, Baptist and Congregational churches, high, central and 7 ward public schools, a convent, the Wilberforce Educational Institute (colored), a mechanics' institute with a library of 2,000 volumes, an opera house seating 1,500, a music hall, seating 1,300, a skating rink, 4 chartered and several private banks, 2 public parks, and 2 newspapers, the *Planet*, tri-weekly and weekly, and the *Banner*, weekly. Grain, malt, flour, produce, and the products of the various manufactures are shipped. Assessed valuation of real and personal property, \$3,260,334. The town is lighted with gas, has a street railroad, good fire department, and telephone connection with neighboring towns. Steamboats run daily to Detroit and Windsor, giving water communication with the great lake system. Population, 8,500. Telegraph, GNW. Express, American. Mail daily. Distance from Toronto, 180 miles, from Windsor, 46 miles, from London, 60 miles. Samuel Barfoot, postmaster.
