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Plymouth Rocks.

The above cut represents a variety of Fowls called the Plymouth Rocks. They are comparatively speaking a new variety, and have been bred in Canada only a few years. They are an American Breed, and we believe of New England origin. They are in color a dark Dornique, with single combs, and clean dusky yellow legs. They are good layers of large size eggs; and a good square built, heavy bodied bird. They are also

very hardy, and the young chicks very easy to raise. We have no hesitation in recommending them as a first class fowl, for farmers as well as fanciers; and we are glad to see that at all the Exhibitions for the last year, they have been well represented; and we have no doubt but in a year or two, we shall see the Plymouth Fowl as well represented at all our Exhibitions, as any other variety of the Asiatics are now.
