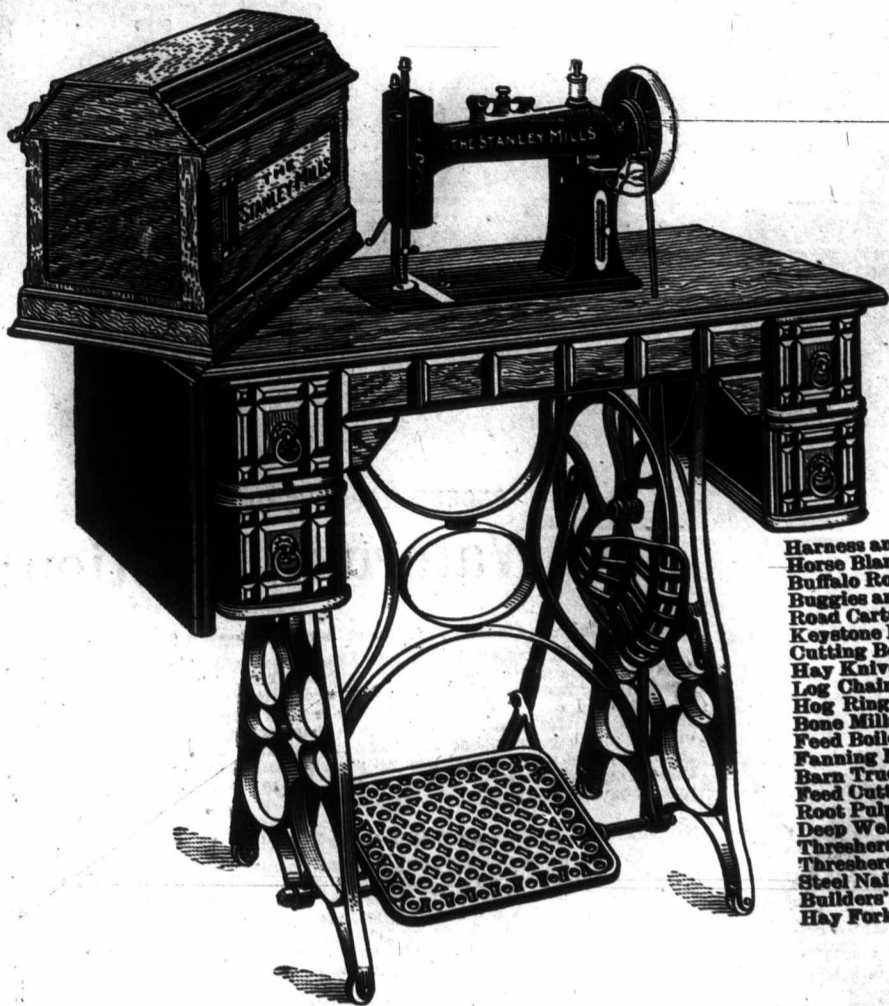

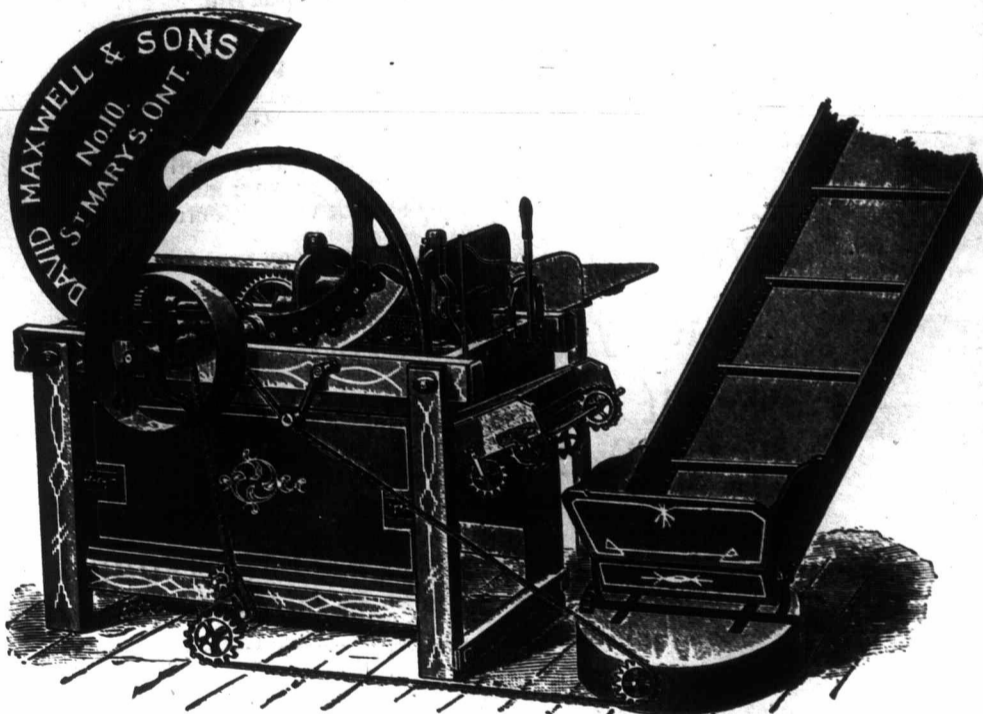

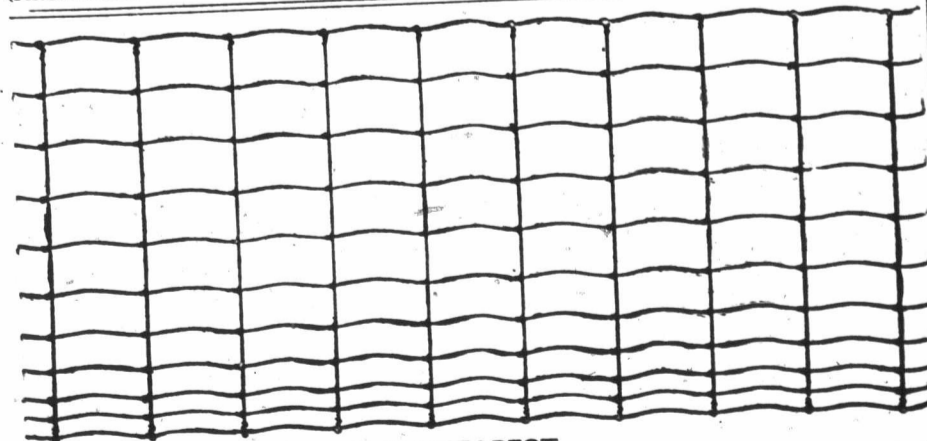

H. BENNETT & SON'S BERKSHIRES, CHESTER WHITES, AND POULTRY.

Upon our visit to Messrs. Bennett & Son's farm, in Norfolk County, near St. Williams, Ont., we were not only well received but shown over their stock for the third time within the short space of a trifle over a year. We are able to see very marked improvement. The Berkshire herd now figure up to some forty odd animals, and although many of the older matrons are still in the herd, we are pleased to be able to report the presence of additional purchases of great importance. In looking over them we saw the daughter of the grand old Baron Lee 4th, Lady Bennett, in her two-year-old form, and although she reared alone fine pigs last spring, she is still in grand form, and again safely in pig to farrow in the fall, and from that litter Mr. Bennett still has a pair of splendid lengthy boars, good enough for the owner of any herd to be proud of. Bennett's Choice is also in splendid shape, and from her last litter we were shown some youngsters of which Mr. Bennett is justly proud, being splendidly marked and good individuals. She also is being bred to farrow in the fall. Ruthania 5177, by Emperor 4126, and out of Lady Pollard 2691, is a trifle over a year old, and possesses a good amount of depth with sweet quality, and due to farrow just before the Toronto Fair. Violet 5763, by Tom Lee 4131, and out of Maud 5216, is rising a year. When three months old she was purchased from her breeder, Thomas Teasdale, Concord. She is a good type of a sow, with sufficient size, carrying her evenness well through, with a splendid back and head and good markings. She is also to be bred this fall. The splendidly formed sire, Bright Star 472, by Star One 3071, and out of Foxcote 2832, is still at the head and doing service, and from the impression he is making we would say that he is largely responsible for placing this herd among the foremost of the breed in the Province. Although two past, he retains his activity to a remarkable degree for a sire of his weight, and as Mr. Bennett expressed it, no more sure sire ever lived. Since our last visit to the farm, the young bear, Knight of Riverside 48108, by Belle Knight V. 34779, and out of Baroness Lady 42508, was introduced. He was purchased from his breeders, Messrs. A. J. Lovejoy & Son, Roscoe, Ill., for a long price, to employ on the young Bright Star females, and in his selection we feel open to state that we believe Mr. Bennett to develop into a grand animal, for he promises to develop into a grand animal, with a great wealth of quality all over, and we will feel our disappointment keenly if he fails to create a sensation when introduced into the showings this fall.

Also lately imported are a pair of Ohio Improved Cheshers from the herd of Mr. P. K. Patterson, Greenwood P.O. The sow, Canada's Pride 10992, by McKinley 2nd, and out of Ohio Nancy 6716, was farrowed in March; while the boar, Perfection King, is about the same age. They promise to make a pair of large animals, having much good quality and well furnished with bone. The poultry pens this fall are in full bloom, and we saw some splendid young Barred Plymouth Rocks, as well as a few choice Wyandottes lately added from some of the best flocks.
