

THIRTEENTH ANNUAL CONGRESS

The thirteenth annual Eucharistic Congress of the diocese of London was held on June 19th, the Feast of Corpus Christi, at Parkhill, Ont. Low Masses were celebrated at an early hour in Parkhill and Borliss, the Mission Church, at which almost all the members of the parish received Holy Communion.

A temporary altar was erected on the lawn in front of the church, at which Pontifical High Mass was celebrated at 10.30 a. m. by His Lordship, the Right Rev. M. F. Fallon, D. D., Bishop of London, in the presence of a large congregation.

Immediately after the Mass the Blessed Sacrament was carried in solemn procession from the church grounds through the main streets of Parkhill. Rev. L. M. Forristal, London, Ont., marshalled the procession.
