And by the 23d Section of an Act made in the same Year, intitled, an aft to amend, render more effectual and tenuce into one Act, the several Laws, made by the General-Affembly of this Province, relating to the Duties of Excise on Rum and other diffilled Spirituous Liquors.

It is Enacted, That the Monies arifing from the Duties imposed by the said Acts, shall be, and are appropriated for the Payment of Bounties and Premiums and other Uses, as already specified and directed by the Laws of this Province, or that may hereafter be directed by the General-Affembly, which faid Acts are continued in Force to the 1st Day of July, 1772. And whereas it is thought highly incumbent on the Legislature, that the Faith of Government be supported by a punctual Payment of the Interest due on the Treasurer's Notes and Warrants on the Treasury bearing Interest;

Resolved, That so much of the Monies arising from the Dutics imposed by the faid above recited Acts, after Payment of the Expence of collecting the fame, shall be first applied by the Treasurer to the Payment of such annual Interest as shall remain due on Treasurer's Notes and Warrants on the Treasury, bearing Interest, more than the Duty of Excise on Wines, which are already applied to that Purpose, will be sufficient to discharge, and that the Surplus of the faid Monies shall be applied towards defraying fuch Expences of Government as are voted, and agreed on by the General-Assembly.
