SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWE

LAND REGULATIONS. THE sole head of a family, or any m over 18 years old, may homestead quarter section of available Dominion is in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alber Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency the District. Entry by proxy may be me at any Dominion Lands Agency (but Sub-Agency) on certain conditious.

Duties—Six months' residence upon a cultivation of the land in each of the years. A homesteader may live with nine miles of his homestead on a farm of least 80 acres, on certain conditions, habitable house is required except where it is the residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in gestanding may present a quarter-section. standing may pre-empt a quarter-sect along-side his homestead. Price \$3.00 acre. Dutes—Six months' residence in each three years after earning homestead pent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Jemption patent may be obtained as son homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his hor stead right may take a purchased hor stead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 acre. Duties—Must reside six months each of three years, cultivate 50 acres a erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to duction in case of rough, scrubby or st. land.
