## A NEW FEATURE TO THE EAST KENT LICENSE TROUBLE

In Mathew Wilson's Advice to Harwich Clerk Riseborough There is not One Word Authorizing him to Withhold Names Disqualified From Forbes Petition

It has been intimated that Clerk Riseborough, of Harwich, in withholding the names stricken off the certificate for hotel license in Cedar Springs, as presented by Hotelman Forbes, acted on the advice given him by Township Solicitor Matthew Wilson, K. C. Clerk Riseborough and Rev. Mr. Kennedy, of Cedar Springs, have written lengthy letters to the local press defending Mr. Riseborough's stand in withholding the names struck off the list. From these letters the reader is led to believe that the Clerk acted strictly on the advice of the Township Solicitor in all his actions with regard to the certificate.

In view of these facts, The Planet has secured a copy of the written legal advice supplied Clerk Riseborough by Mr. Wilson. It is quite apparent that nowhere in this document did Solicitor Wilson advise Mr. Riseborough to withhold names struck off the petition.

The following is a true copy of Mr. Wilson's letter of advice: Mr. G. W. Riseborough, Clerk Township of Harwich, P. O. Box "A,"

Blenheim, Ont.: Dear Sir,—In reply to the several questions which you have asked in regard to your decision to be given under section 11, sub-section 14, I beg to advise you as follows:

The date upon which you should test the qualification of the elector is in my opinion the last date upon which the application for license should be filed with the inspector, the inspector then being authorized to consider the applicant for the purpose of reporting upon him.

In my opinion after certificate has been filed there is no power to those signing the certificate to withdraw their names from the certificate. The document causes to be under their control and any other document which might be sent in either to the commissioners or to the inspectors is not a document to be considered or which is provided for under the Act and, therefore, cannot affect that which is a legal document duly presented to be considered.

It is quite true that in local improvement works, such as your Drainage Act, the withdrawal of petitioners is allowed, but such withdrawals are based upon the proper wording of the statute, and the very fact of one statute providing for such withdrawals and the other omitting to make any such provision confirms that under the Liquor License Act there is no power to withdraw from the certificate in question.

With regard to parties who are upon the voters' list for one polling division but who have no property in that polling division, although they have property in and reside in other polling divisions within the electoral district, I am of opinion that they are entitled to be counted as electors for the polling division in which their names are entered on the voters' list. This opinion arises from the fact that you have simply to test who would be a qualified elector in the same way practically as if you were deputy returning officer, and a deputy returning officer would not be entitled to question whether a person had been properly put on the voters' list for a particular division but would be entitled only to put to the elector the oaths provided for in the statute. If, therefore, the elector can take the oaths and his name is upon the voters' list for the polling sub-division, I am of opinion that you are justified in treating him as being an elector for that sub-division. He would be entitled to vote and could not be prevented from voting in that polling sub-division. The oath requires him to swear that he resides within the electoral division, and, of course, he, if domiciled within the polling sub-division. My opinion is confined to persons who can take the oath.

As an unfranchised Indian may be properly entered as elector and may vote but although an unfranchised

Indian's name may appear upon the voters' list he may be required to take the oath that he is an unfranchised Indian and if he cannot take the oath, then he is not a duly qualified elector. Of course, if he is an Indian who does not reside on an Indian reserve or amongst Indians, or belong to an Indian band, such as provided in the Dominion statutes, he may be assessed and placed upon the roll and be entitled to vote as other persons, but in such case he does not claim the right to vote as an unfranchised Indian. I take the liberty of enclosing to you a form of certificate to be made by you after you shall have considered the matter and come to such conclusion as you think proper. By keeping closely to the form of certificate many difficulties which might otherwise arise will disappear. The certificate is made out as for Division No. 3 but you can make a similar one for any other division. You should give a separate certificate in each case.

In regard to the taking of evidence, you should advise the representatives of both sides to the dispute of a day and hour and place when you will take any evidence they desire to offer. You are not limited to hearing evidence which they produce but you may search for and find evidence on your own accord. You may satisfy yourself either by documentary evidence or by sworn testimony. You are not obliged to swear the witnesses but you will probably consider it better to do so, and you may reserve judgment and fill in the certificate at subsequent date after you shall have considered the questions raised by some new argument being advanced even as to the matter upon which I have given you an opinion, you may take evidence and reserve your final decision and consult any lawyer in regard to questions of law, as to which you have a doubt, but the ultimate decision will be with yourself.

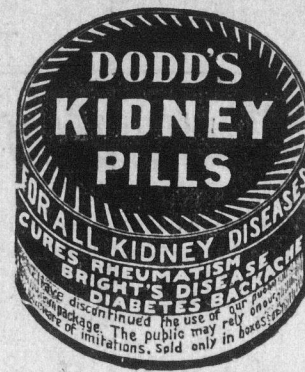
