



TO THE EDITOR, SIR:—The M. & B. Ry. Co. intend to hold a meeting next week. It is hoped that the shareholders will adopt measures, first to have the Railway completed and secondly to have it run properly. Although largely subsidied by public money, it has never yet been finished. Miles of it remain unballasted, and in a very rough condition, so rough, indeed, that is only a question of months when train service will have to be suspended. The fences are down and cattle are making the track a highway. A number have been killed. Merchants are complaining that the train hands and the section men do not pay their bills. The men complain that they have not had a regular pay for overa year. The company owes them some \$3,000. It seems there is a mortgage on the Railway, so that there is no redgess through the ordinary court of law.
