Mr. Wm. Macdonald, President of the

Commercial Union, has returned to the city,

expressing himself thoroughly satisfied with

the result of the commercial union meetings

which he attended in Western Ontario.

He says:—"Two or three conservative

views which I met at Orangeville, ex-

pressed a fear that unrestricted recipro-

city might lead to annexation, I

reminded them that the experiment had

already been tried; that from 1854 up

1865 reciprocity in all the material pro-

ductions of Canada and the United

States existed; that during no other

twelve years of our history had the coun-

try enjoyed greater prosperity or had

less about annexation. They had heard

or read this suggestion in some of the

minor organs of our monopolist govern-

ment, but their strong desire as farmers

is to get easy access to the American

markets for their animal products,

horses, etc. The annexation bugbear

will not stop the movement."
