Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations. West Land Regulations. A NY person who is the sole head of a fam-icy, or any male over 25 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of availant or Alberta. The applicant must appear in per-sear the distant. Eatry by proxy may by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or solver of intending homesteader. Duties-Six monthe' residence upon and cultivation of the hand in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of al least 80 acres, solely owned and cocupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sis-fater, mother, son, daughter, brother or sis-fater, mother, son, daughter, brother or sis-father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sis-ter.

Beef that has been in brine but a few Beef that has been in brine but a few days is best put into boiling water to cook. As soon as the water-boils again skim well and set back where it will simmer until very tender. Corned beef is much better if cooled in the water in which it is cooked. If beef is very salt it is better to put it on in coldwater, but in either case cook slowly. When beef is to be pressed place it with the fibrer running lengthwise of the pan or mold, as the slices will then cut across the grain. Set another the grain the grain. Set another pan on the beef and a flatiron in it for a weight.
