Squash and pumpkins 1' kept in cool place may ha e rot ed by this time but if the ar still in good condition they will keep much longer if pu in a room where the temperature is a o e 500 Fahr.

If colery las tegun to rot, the plan s should be a'l gone over diseased parts or plants removed, and her replanted se that the ops are kept dry as long as the plants last if there is room have a small space etween the top of each plant. To keep celery in good condition during the winter the tops should be dry but e roots in moist soil, hence if water rg is necessary great ca e should be aren rot to wet the tops.

It is not difficul for a farmer to care for his vegualles in winter as he has, as a rate, a good cool celtar, ut 'n cities cell irs are usually too warm for most veretables, 'ence where the main cellar is too warra whereever possible a part of it where cool air can be admitted shoul! be rartitioned off from the rest for a vegetable room.
