CABLE NEWS.

Special Evening Telegram.
LONDON, Sept. 11.
The Daily Graphic suggests that the decision of France to concentrate her fleet in the Mediterranean, taken together with England's virtual desertion of the Mediterranean in favor of the North Sea, is the result of the recent Russo-French naval agreement, and indicates the understanding for a naval triple alliance between England, France and Russia. Under this, England will protect the North Sea and English Channel, and France the Mediterranean.

PORTLAND, Me., Sept. 10.
The political overturn in yesterday's Maine State election, in which the Republicans won back the Governorship, and secured three out of four congressmen and sufficient majority on a joint ballot in the Legislature to secure the election of a Republican State Senator, became more apparent to-day with the revised additional returns. The vote, with twenty-eight small towns missing, shows: Haines (Rep.) 70,972; Planted (Dem.) 66,515. The Legislature will stand on a joint ballot—ninety-four Republicans to seventy-eight Democrats—with ten districts yet to report. The Senate will be made up of twenty-two Republicans and eight Democrats, one district still being missing. The House will be composed of seventy-two Republicans and seventy Democrats, nine districts missing.

LONDON, Sept. 10.
A serious situation exists in Mongolia, according to a Pekin despatch to the Daily Mail. Kobo, in Western Mongolia, has fallen, and Altai is considered to be in great danger at the hands of the revolutionists. The Cabinet has discussed the advisability of asking Russia to mediate between China and Mongolians, who are said to be preparing to fight China to a finish if any attempt is made to establish Chinese rule in Mongolia. Chinese reports from Pekin to the Times says the Governor of Illi, in the Province of Singkiang, which borders Mongolia, has been warned by the Russian Consul that if Chinese troops are despatched to Kobo to suppress the Mongolian rising, Russian assistance will be given the Mongolians.

PARIS, Sept. 10.
The recently negotiated French Naval Convention relating to the Mediterranean seaboard, will be brought into practical operations within a few days, when the French fleet, which heretofore has had its headquarters at Brest, will be permanently transferred to Toulon. This naval move will give France complete control in the Mediterranean over any possible combination of the Triple Alliance, and it will leave to England the defence of the North Sea, while Russia guards

the Baltic. Experts point out that with the Russian fleet in the Baltic, the British fleet will be materially increased against any contemplated German attack, while the English Channel is considered sufficiently defended by the numerous fleets of destroyers and submarines stationed on both the English and French coasts.

LONDON, Sept. 11.
The inclemency of the weather that England is experiencing was shown at noon yesterday, when the temperature was the same as on last Christmas Eve. A woman who spent the night in the open in Surrey, died from exposure. On the Continent the weather is severe at a number of places. At St. Moritz, Switzerland, the temperature fell to freezing point yesterday. Heavy rain falls are reported in central and western Germany. In the mountain district of Bavaria, cold weather prevails, and so much snow has fallen that winter sports are being engaged in.

VIENNA, Sept. 11.
Fighting broke out between the Turks and Bulgarians on the frontier, according to messages received from Constantinople and Sofia. The Bulgarians opened hostilities by firing from the frontier fort upon the Turkish patrol. The latter returned fire, killing five Bulgarians. Bulgarian reinforcements soon came up, whereupon the Turkish commander armed Mohammedan peasants in the vicinity, and added them to his forces. A battle raged all day, with many casualties.
