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Sir John Crosbie, K.B.E.

THE BEST ABUSED MAN BUT THE PEOPLE'S HOPE.

Our friends of the Daily Star have worked overtime the past three weeks in abusing Sir John Crosbie. He has received more attention in this respect than any member of the Opposition. And why is this so? Simply because he is relentless in showing up the scandalous conduct of the Government in connection with fish, railways, ships and the various ways in which the Squires Government have squandered the people's money. It is a good thing for poor old Newfoundland that we have such a man as Sir John Crosbie to-day. A true born son of the soil he loves his native country and the people look to him and Sir Michael Cashin to save us from Confederation, or the status of a Crown Colony. All the abuse that the Star pours out daily on Sir John is not going to lessen his popularity, nor the high regard in which he is held by all classes and creeds. Go on Sir John, the people are behind you and regard you as the man of destiny, who will prevent the poor pitiful cry of sectarianism being used to allow incapable men, who have no other political asset, to hold on to power and finish the ruin of this unfortunate country. Sir John Crosbie is too big and too broad minded a man to live in such an atmosphere and for this reason the people of all creeds respect him, and trust in him, and believe that he is the man who to-day can do most to save Newfoundland from ruin.

It fills one with nausea to read the effusions of the Star Editors criticising such a man as Sir John Crosbie, whose shoes they are not worthy to untie. The Lord preserve us from grammar Governments if that is all Mr. Squires and Mr. Barnes can give the people. If the circumstances of youth did not give Sir John Crosbie the opportunity of getting a University education, the good sound judgment and common sense with which Nature endowed him were sharpened and improved in the practical school of experience, and the business of Newfoundland, which enabled him to achieve the commercial and political success that is his to-day. A warm hearted man of broad sympathies, an outspoken and sincere man, Sir John Crosbie stands to-day a credit to his native land, and too strongly entrenched in public estimation and respect for the petty shafts of spite, spleen and jealousy of the Star scribblers to do him any harm. In open handed charity he stands in a class alone amongst our men of wealth, and his publicly acknowledged gifts and donations are only a small proportion of what he gives to the poor and needy, and those who are in financial troubles. The writer is aware that Sir John will not thank him for saying so much on this point and that he prefers to keep his right hand from knowing what is given by the left in the daily practice, but one cannot refrain from saying so much when such a public benefactor and big hearted helper of his fellow men, the friend of widows and orphans is vilified daily by the Jackals of a hostile press. He has the philosophic viewpoint as regards riches and believes in doing as much good as he can with them, while he is making the journey of life, instead of leaving his donations and benefactions to see the light of day first in his published last will and testament. He likes to see people made happy by his help while he is in the flesh, and to me at least, this is the greatest proof that the man has a great intellect and an innate love of doing good to mankind. Grammar, syntax and rhetoric and university degrees will not put this within a man. He must have it by the gift of Nature. The spiteful shafts of ridicule of the Star seem poor, petty and mean in the light of this, and reminds one of a crackle barking at the moon, and his thousands of friends all over the country regard them I hope in the same way. Go on Sir John; pursue the even tenor of your way. The more the Government scribbles abuse you the more the public will know that you are exposing their deeds, and the infamous waste of the public revenues, the past 18 months.
