The debate on the repeal resolutions is now drawing to a close. Attorney-General Wilkins rose to close the debate on Thursday. In the course of his speech he said:—"I now give notice to Canada and to England, and they will hear me, that if the grievances of Nova Scotia are not redressed, and the liberties of her people restored before the next session of this House, then we shall undertake to redress them ourselves. Mr. Blanchard told us that if we declare ourselves out of the Union we have no law to collect the revenue.
