W. W. STUART DEAD  
Prominent Albertan Passes Away in  
Ontario.  
W. W. Stuart of Calgary, inspector  
of ranches, a well known Calgary citi-  
zen, who is also well known in Alberta,  
died at Glenora on Wednesday night.  
The news of his death was received  
by his brother, Mr. Justice Stuart in  
Macleod yesterday.  
The late Mr. Stuart was born in  
Middlesex county 45 years ago. When  
a young man he came to Manitoba. In  
1888 he and another brother drove a  
bunch of cattle from Manitoba to  
Jumping Pond where Mr. Stuart ac-  
quired a ranch. He has been in the  
Calgary district ever since.  
He was a candidate for the northwest  
legislature for West Calgary some  
years ago. He was appointed inspec-  
tor of ranches and later inspector  
of ranches. He was very highly re-  
spected by all who knew him and had  
very many friends. He leaves a widow  
and two children. The funeral will  
take place today.

INTERESTING SERVICES  
HELD LAST NIGHT

The interest in the Crossley and Hunt-  
er Meetings increasing

The meeting which was held at  
Knox church last night by Messrs.  
Crossley and Hunter was fairly well  
attended. After the usual songs Mr.  
Hunter called upon the audience to  
pray for the hotel keepers. Mr.  
Hunter stated that he had no objec-  
tion to the hotel business as long as  
it did not entail the business of the  
bar. Mr. Hunter said he expected to  
save 1000 souls in Calgary. He  
claimed that there had been 800  
souls saved in Brockville during their  
services.

The note of personal salvation was  
cast forth by the preacher and he  
stated that "love tales made him  
sick" and that only in the Bible did  
he find rest. Mr. Hunter said that  
although he had never been bad he  
had been saved from sin. After mak-  
ing a statement concerning the neces-  
sity of confession to God, he ap-  
pealed to the reporters not to for-  
get it, if there were any reporters  
present.

Mr. Crossley spoke on the Good  
Shepherd. After singing "There are  
Ninety and Nine" in his own inimit-  
able way, he emphasized the impor-  
tance of the Bible and referred to  
the acrobatics which had been made  
by himself and which would be found  
on the back of the hymn book, which  
was sold in the church.

The Bible was no foolstool. King  
Edward VI. said "The Bible is the  
Bible." Most of the objections  
which were made to the Bible were  
objections to the book of Deuteronomy.  
The Bible was the only dic-  
tionary in the world.

The meeting throughout was con-  
ducted last night at a faster pace  
than upon the previous occasions and  
the appeal which the evangelists  
made was not so strenuous. At the  
end of the session nine persons  
were called to the Lord.

Montreal, Jan. 4.—Because the Grey  
Nuns have not found it expedient to  
remove from their present headquar-  
ters in Montreal, the plan for what  
should be the largest apartment house  
in the city is for the time being set  
aside. For the square block of land  
bounded by St. Catherine, Litchester,  
Guy and St. Matthews streets, upon  
which stands the massive buildings of  
the community, the sisters received an  
offer of a million and a quarter. The  
offer was made by a syndicate and the  
matter was discussed at a meeting of  
the Chapter but has not been accept-  
ed.

Ottawa, Jan. 4.—Ralph Smith can  
have the governorship of the Yukon if  
he will take it. He has not yet made  
up his mind but is considering the  
offer. One thing holding him back is the  
possibility that the minister of labor  
may be appointed soon, freed from re-  
sponsibilities of administering any other  
department, and his friends say he  
may get it. There is doubt, however,  
on this point, and Mr. Smith is being  
urged to accept the substance, as other  
office may be merely a shadow.

### COLD WEATHER IN CLEVELAND

Thousands of Homes Without  
Light or Heat.

Cleveland, Jan. 4.—With a cold  
eye bearing down on the city, the  
forerunner of which set in this af-  
ternoon, and is increasing in sever-  
ity tonight, Cleveland's natural gas  
supply is completely cut off tonight  
and thousands of homes are with-  
out either heat or illumination. No  
relief is promised until sometime to-  
morrow, probably late in the day.

done by an explosion early today.

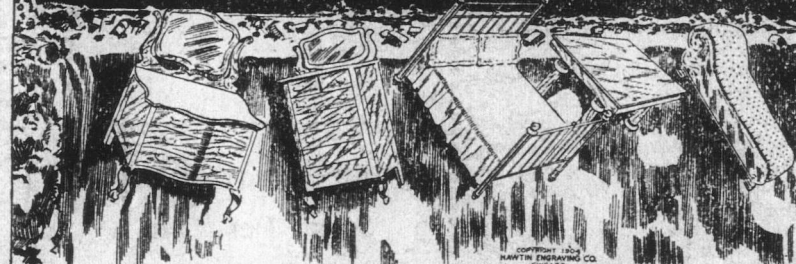
