W. W. STUART DEAD
Prominent Albertan Passes Away in Ontario.

W. W. Stuart of Calgary, inspector of ranches, a well known Calgary citizen, who is also well known in Alberta, died at Glencle on Wednesday night. The news of his death was received by his brother, Mr. Justice Stuart in Macleod yesterday.

The late Mr. Stuart was born in Middlesex county 45 years ago. When a young man he came to Manitoba. In 1888 he and another brother drove a bunch of cattle from Manitoba to Jumping Pond where Mr. Stuart settled on a ranch. He has been in the Calgary district ever since.

He was a candidate in the northwest legislature for West Calgary some years ago. He was appointed inspector of homesteads and later inspector of ranches. He was very highly respected by all who knew him and had very many friends. He leaves a widow and two children. The funeral will take place today.

Montreal, Jan. 4.—Because the Grey Nuns have not found it expedient to remove from their present headquarters in Montreal, the plan for what would be the largest apartment house in the city is for the time being set aside. For the square block of land bounded by St. Catharines, Leinster, Guy and St. Matthews streets, upon which stands the massive buildings of the community, the sisters received an offer of a million and a quarter. The offer was made by a syndicate and the matter was discussed at a meeting of the Chapter but has not been accepted.

Ralph Smith Can Go to Yukon
Ottawa, Jan. 4.—Ralph Smith can have the governorship of the Yukon if he will take it. He has not yet made up his mind but is considering the offer. One thing holding him back is the possibility that the minister of labor may be appointed soon, freed from responsibilities of administering any other department, and his friends say he may get it. There is doubt, however, on this point, and Mr. Smith is being urged to accept the substance, as either office may be merely a shadow.

Thousands of Homes Without Light or Heat.


