SENT FOR TRIAL.

New Light in the Mount Brydges Robbery.

Benjamin Fisher to Be Tried at the Spring Assizes-New Light in the Affair.

At the afternoon session of the court held in the Fisher case, Fred Pearce, son of the postmaster at Mount Brydges, gaveevidence similar to that of his father, but the son also showed that Fisher had brought back the box, together with one of the letters stolen.

Inspector Daniel O'Leary, who went to Mount Brydges to investigate the robbery, made a thorough examination of the premises and concluded that the building was entered either by a window in the ceilar, which was open on the night of the robbery, or through a door for which the burglar had a key. There was no trace of a forcible entrance having been effected. After the inspection, Mr. O'Leary, together with Detective Ward, of London West, went to Fisher's house about 7:30 o'clock Friday morning and told Fisher he was under arreston the chargeof robbing the postoffice. Fisher called Pearce a vile name, saying that he (Pearce) had told him (Fisher) that if the box was returned nothing more would be said about the robbery. Witness then told Fisher that a search warrant was to be executed, and warned him that any statements he made could be used in evidence against him. Fisher told witness to search, and said he was not fool enough to keep the stamps "around there."

On cross-examination by Mr. McEvoy, witness got somewhat tangled, and had to stop and think. He altered the last statement somewhat, and admitted having asked Fisher (while he was searching the house) whether or not he (witness) was near the

This closed the evidence for the prosecution. Messrs. J. B. McKillop and E. Meredith held that the testimony was sufficient to send the prisoner for trial. Fisher had produced the stolen box and the letter; he had admitted to Pearce that he had the stamps and money, and that he would return the box if Pearce would say nothing about the theft. O'Leary's evidence, it was claimed also, was enough to send Fisher for trial.

Mr. McEvoy held that the prisoner had said nothing that showed him to be guilty, though he had made statements which a

wise person would not make. Squire Smyth did not review the evidence, but decided that he could not do otherwise than commit Fisher for trial. Mr. McEvoy then applied to which Mr. McKillop did not object, pro-Mr. McEvoy then applied for bail, to viding the ame was sufficient. suggested \$2,000

This was readily secured, the prisoner giving a surety of \$1,000, while Henry Clay, J. J. Fisher, George Bignell and David Gardiner gave sureties of \$250 each. The case will come up at the Spring Assizes.
